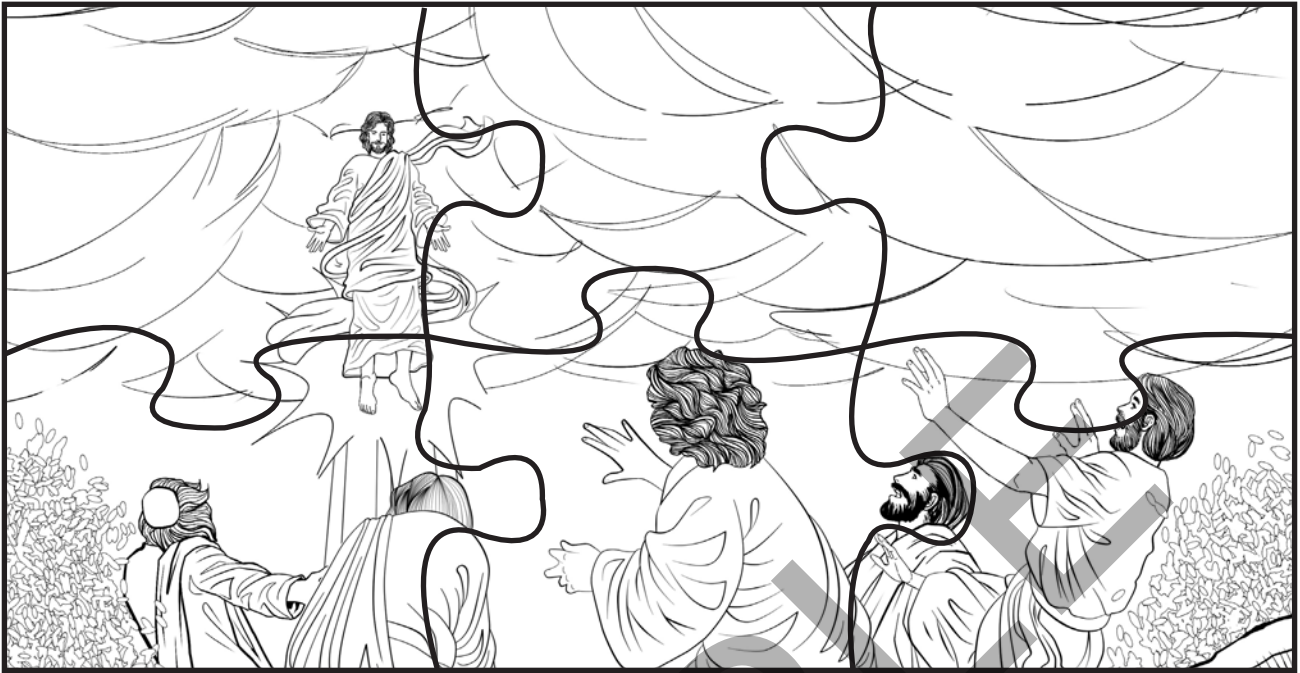


Lessons from Story:
