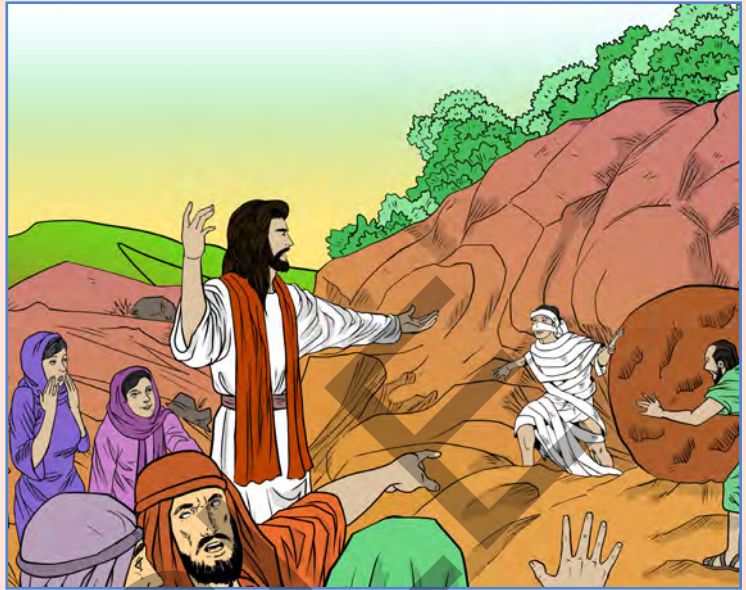
Lesson 21: JESUS AND LAZARUS

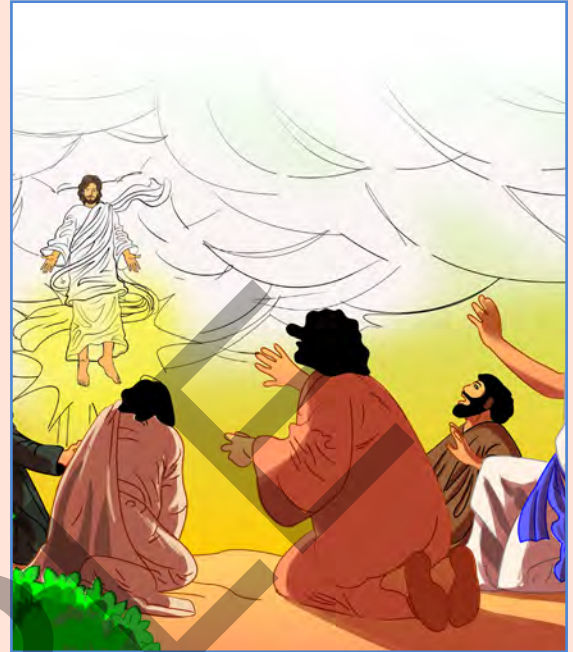
Lesson 34: THE GREAT COMMISSION

3. Jesus tells them to wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit who will guide and empower them as they take His message to the whole world.

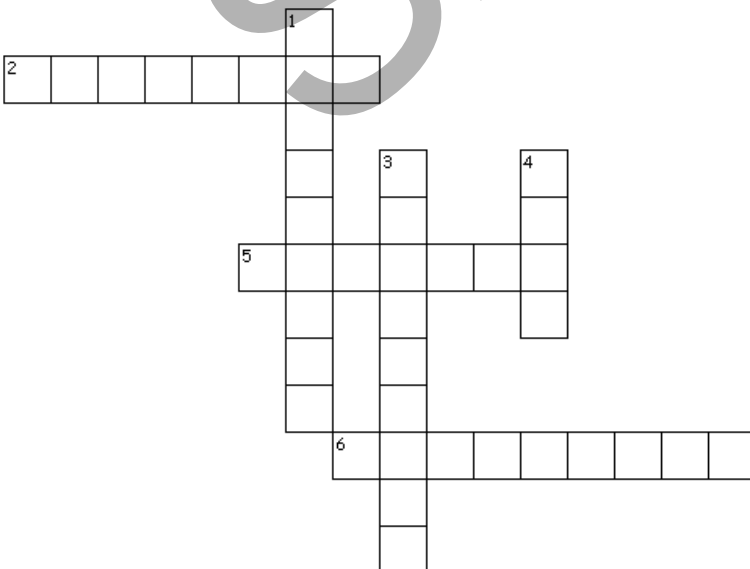
