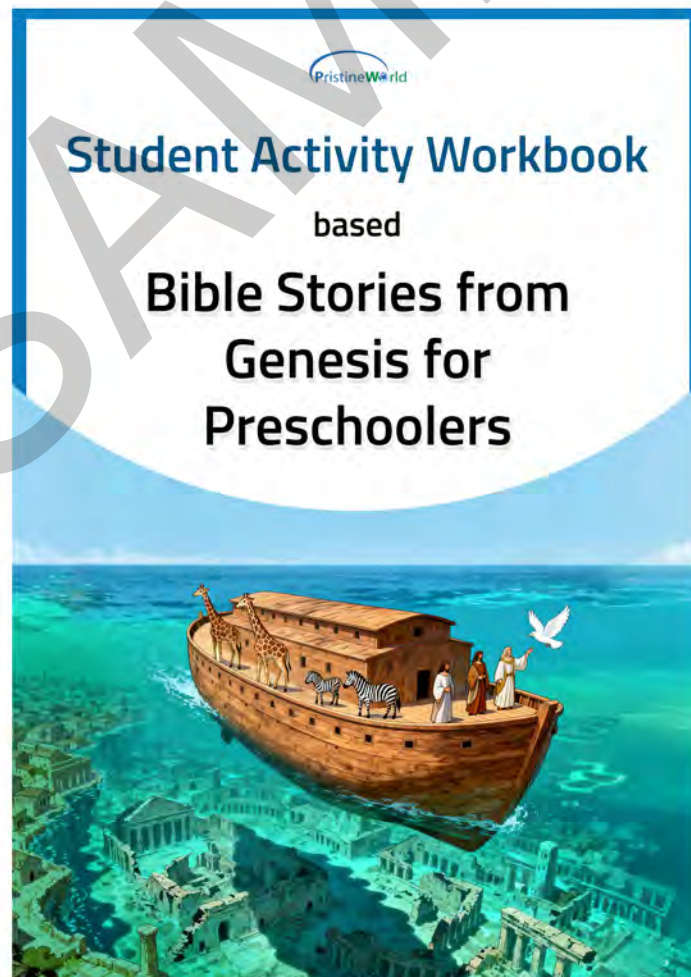

CHAPTER 1

The Creation of the World

Key Lessons:

The world was made by the one true and living God. He made the world beautiful and perfect.

Key Bible verse:

Genesis 1:1 In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

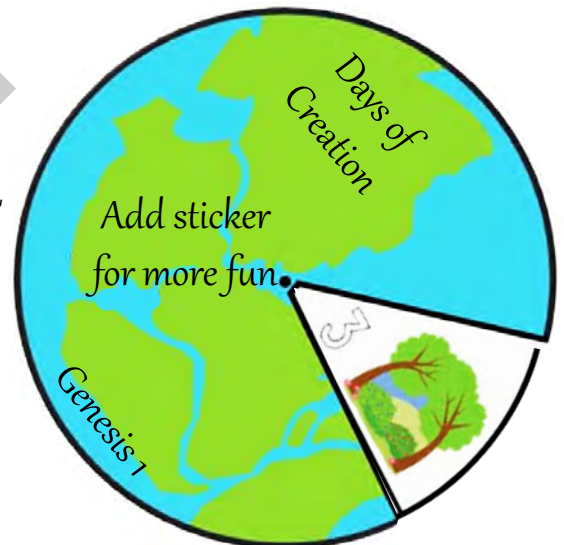
Activity 1: Discover: True or False

Activity 2: Day of Creation Spinner.

Instructions:

- Give each child a paper plate.
- Divide it into 7 sections like a pie.
- In each section, draw or paste pictures for each day of creation (Day 1: light/dark, Day 2: sky/water, Day 3: land/plants, Day 4: sun/moon/stars, Day 5: fish/birds, Day 6: animals/people, Day 7: rest).
- Attach a smaller paper plate on top with a window cut out so only one section shows at a time.
- Use a paper fastener in the middle so it spins.

CHAPTER 2

The Garden of Eden

Key Lessons:

God put Adam and Eve in the beautiful Garden of Eden. He loved them very much and told them they could stay in the Garden as long as they obeyed Him.

Key Bible verse:

Genesis 2:7 Then the Lord God took some soil from the ground and he made a man. He breathed air into the nose of the man to give him life and gave him life.

Workbook Answers

Activity 1:

- Give each child a sheet of paper.
- Let them draw a garden and paste real leaves, flowers, and grass to make it beautiful.
- Add animal stickers or cut-outs.
- Remind them this was the special garden God made for Adam and Eve.

Materials: paper, glue, crayons, leaves, flowers, grass, animal stickers or cut-outs.

CHAPTER 3

A Sad Day in the Beautiful Garden

Key Lessons:

God wants us to be obedient to Him

Key Bible verse:

After they had sinned, the man and the woman were sent out of the Garden of Eden. An angel stopped Adam and Eve from entering the Garden

Workbook Answers

Activity 1:

Add pictures of Adam and Eve eating the fruit, and the serpent, which the children can colour and cut and add on, into the 3-D cut-out which they made in previous lesson.



Activity 2:

Ask the children to hold the two symbols. Then some children in the team can say an action e.g.

- ask permission before going out of the house or classroom – the symbol keeper student should lift the “GO” symbol higher
- steal someone’s food – the symbol keeper student should lift the “STOP” symbol
And they can change symbol keepers and play while supervised by the teacher

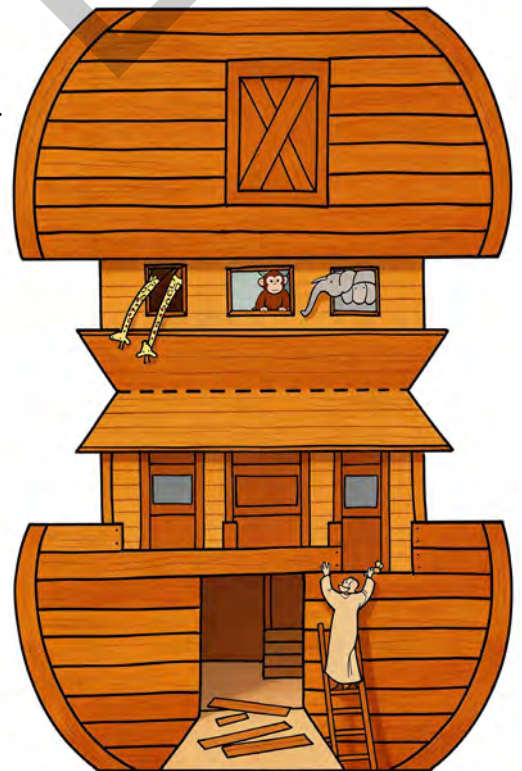

- Talk about how God told Noah to build it to save his family and the animals.

Key Bible verse:

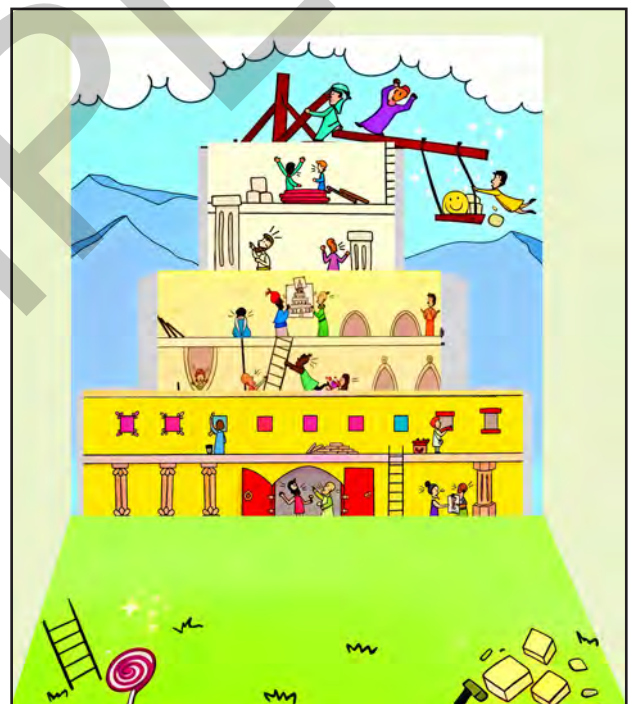
"Pride leads to destruction, and arrogance to downfall." Proverbs 16:18

Key Lessons:

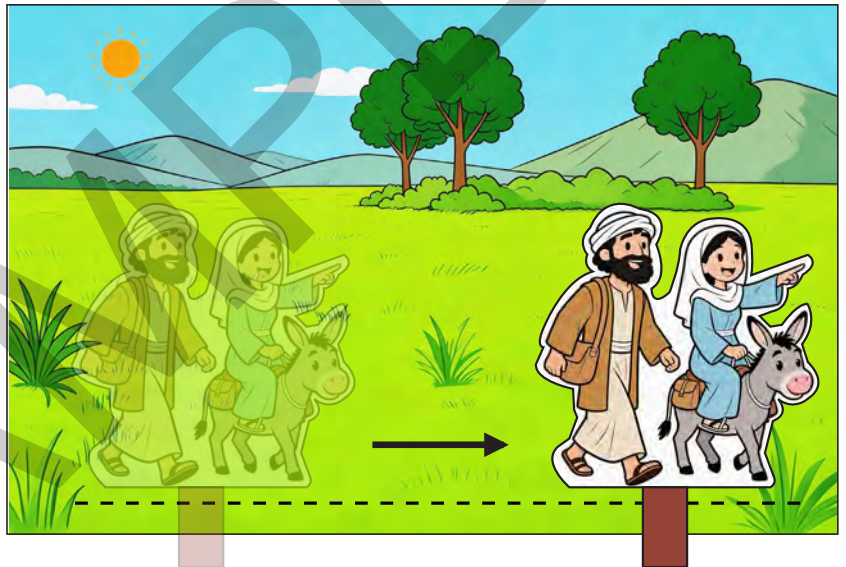
Abram has faith in God and trusts Him, even though he knows leaving home will be difficult.

Abraham and his servant both trust God to find the right woman to be Isaac's wife.

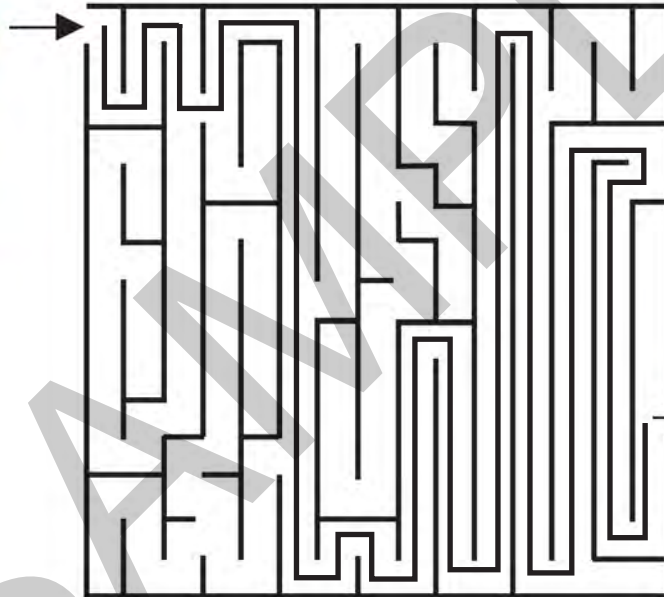

4. God makes a way to forgive our sins

This way is through Jesus who died on the cross and rose on the third day for the forgiveness of our sins

- Provide a large star outline.
- Children decorate with shiny stickers and write "Jesus – God's Gift to the World."
